MULTI MIND! seeks fundamental breakthroughs in multilingualism research while training early stage researchers. Its main scientific objectives are:

1. What is the role of environmental, language architecture, and domain general factors on language learning, cognition, and creativity?
2. How do the properties of the language and orthographic systems affect the way people process language?
3. What are the cognitive mechanisms underpinning social cognition, what is the role of language as a social group marker, and how does language use affect decision making and the manifestation of stereotypes?
4. What is the impact of multilingualism in children with language impairment?
5. How efficient are teaching methods and educational activities promoting language and literacy in schools for migrants and refugees and what are good practices that meet their needs?



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
